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Emporia's First Baptist Church Dedicates New Youth Center

On Sunday, April 19, 2009 the First Baptist Church (FBC) of Emporia, VA dedicated its new youth center. The center will provide much needed space for the church youth, as well as the First Baptist Christian Academy, Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed (AWANA) Program and the youth of the community in general. At the ribbon-cutting ceremony Mark Yeattes, Chairman of Deacons, and Jeff Robinson, Chairman of the Long Range Planning Committee, had the honor of cutting the ribbon and formally dedicating the center.

According to long-time church member John Thurman, CEO of Personal Care Preferred Group and one of several local business owners who made a donation toward the building project, "The new building is a long-awaited and very much welcomed addition to the church." According to Robinson, "For many years the First Baptist Church conducted youth activities in an un-insulated metal building that was originally constructed as a maintenance shop. The metal roof condensated and leaked badly, plus the building was cold in the winter."

The new building was replaced with a pre-engineered wood framed structure with insulation and heat. The bottom chords of the roof trusses are vaulted to provide more clearance for youth activities such as volleyball and basketball.
